C.F. MUELLER PARK IMPROVEMENTS

The City of Reedley received a grant from the State Department of Parks and Recreation Land and Water Conservation Fund to help fund some much needed upgrades and repairs to C.F. Mueller Park. The cost of the project was around \$250,000. The grant award was \$98,711; the City matched the remaining balance, as well as doing some of the work.

Improvements include:

- Upgrading current restroom facility and meet all ADA requirements



- Replace broken and worn equipment in existing play structure
- Add new fixtures and lights to existing playground area
- Update pavilion to address structure concerns, add barbecues and resting area
- Add barbecues and tables throughout the park

- Increase amount of lighting throughout the park
- Add a meandering walking trail with lighting throughout the park

If you haven't been in C.F. Mueller Park recently, you might want to stop in to see what all the excitement is about. Or, drive by after dark to see the way the new lighting brightens up the park.

A ribbon cutting was held on December 5, 2015 to celebrate the improvements.



If you haven't been to the Community Center for an event recently, you will be impressed with the changes that have been made in the California (large) Room. Over the last few years we have painted, replaced the tile floor, installed new drapes, stage curtains, and sound boards, etc. This room has really been transformed from a basketball court to a very nice hall suitable for all types of parties and celebrations.

The foyer restrooms have been remodeled – new stalls, toilets, and sinks. In addition, our smaller meeting rooms – Redwood and Kings River rooms—have been upgraded.



Our rooms can be rented for a variety of activities and events. Call our reservation specialist, Jessica Esquibel at 559-637-4203, to assist you with available dates, pricing and to answer any of your questions.

She is also available to give you a tour of the facilities and meet with you one on one to figure how we can meet your specific needs. You may pick up a Facility Use Application in our office at 100 N. East Avenue (on the corner of East and Springfield Avenues by Mueller Park) or online at www.reedley.ca.gov, Departments, Community Services. The completed form is returned to the Community Services office along with the deposit. This will hold the date for you. All fees are due and payable 90 days prior to your event.



You may book up to 12 months in advance. Several meeting rooms are also available at the Community Center for a nominal fee. These rooms vary, but hold up to a maximum of 100 people and are great for small family gatherings and meetings. Our friendly staff will assist you in reserving the room that will best suit your needs. Check out our Facebook page (Reedley Community Center) for a variety of pictures of our rooms and decorating ideas.



Frequently asked questions:

- *Are tables and chairs included? Yes! And, we have both 5 ft. round and 8 ft. rectangular tables. We have tables and chairs for 400 guests.*
- *Do we use your decorations and linens? We don't provide decorations and linens so you are free to make arrangements with any company you chose.*
- *Can we serve alcohol at a Quinceanera? No, alcohol is not allowed at any event for minors per the Reedley Municipal Code.*
- *Why do we have to purchase or provide insurance? Liability insurance is required to protect both the City and you in case someone gets hurt at your event.*
- *Is there an extra charge for set up? We allow you two free hours to decorate a day before your event. Check with our staff to make arrangements.*



PARKS



A total of six parks are available for rental and are appropriate for a variety of activities.

C.F. Mueller Park has a covered pavilion area, BBQs, picnic tables, walking trail, basketball courts and skate park. Pioneer Park has a new pavilion and also has a band shell which can be

used for concerts in the park and other performances. Smith's Ferry and Cricket Hollow Parks are both located on the banks of the Kings River. Picnic tables and barbecues are available for your use. Camacho Park is available for rental for baseball and softball tournaments and other sporting events. Citizens Park is being utilized for soccer and flag football games, has a walking trail, trees, handicapped accessible play structure, restroom facility, recreation equipment room, and basketball

courts. The Sports Park is now open at Dinuba and Zumwalt Avenues and includes areas for soccer, football, youth baseball, covered pavilion, a tot lot and restroom/concession facility. The section of the Rail-Trail behind Reedley College includes a gazebo and picnic tables. Park rentals are also handled through the Community Services office. 

REDUCED FISHING LICENSE



Applications are available for the 2016 State of California Reduced Fee Fishing License. They are \$6.95 for the year and you *must* meet the following restrictions:

- Any person 65 years or older, resident of California and total monthly income from all sources does not exceed \$889.40 for a single person or \$1,496.20 for a couple. Submit income verification from Social Security and include all other income.
- Any honorably-discharged veteran with a service connected disability rating of 50% or more. Proof from Veteran's Administration or a copy of last year's reduced fee license.




